

1. In 1975, a project team which included two LORE officers was formed with the task of reviewing options and recommending a procurement strategy. Which of the following candidates made the short list as replacements for the aging Canadian Centurion tanks:

[X] USA: XM1 (now Abrams) and M60

A serious challenger, with the most modern versions of the M60 forming the bulk of the American armoured fleet in NATO. Soon to be replaced by the XM1, the M60 was considered nearing the end of its life cycle.

[X] UK: Modernized Centurion and Chieftain

Although Israel had successfully modernized the Centurion with a Continental engine and Allison transmission, Vickers, the OEM, had not set up a production line for such a modernization. Centurion would have been an orphan in NATO with the associated logistics challenges.

[X] Germany: Leopard 1 and Leopard 2

Recommended option by the project team. Leopard was in wide use within NATO and a current production line existed for Australia. In short, 'the deal was sealed' when Germany offered to loan a regiment's worth of Leopard 1 A1 for use in Germany while the Canadian Leopards were produced. This became the option supported by DND and cabinet.



Lt Rex Fendick (RCEME - retired as a LCol) won the King's Medal in 1948, Sgt "Bud" Hardy (RCEME - CFR Capt in 1980) won the Queen's Medal in 1956 and Cpl Jimmy Grondin (EME Branch - a Vehicle Technician with 4 Air Defence regiment) won the Queen's medal in 2008.



The Medal for the Best Shot in the British Army, Infantry was instituted by Queen Victoria in 1869 and awarded from 1870 to 1882 to the best shot of the annual British Army shooting competition. In 1923, the medal was re-introduced by King George V and designated *The King's Medal for Champion Shots in the Military Forces* until it was replaced when Queen Elizabeth II came to the throne.
